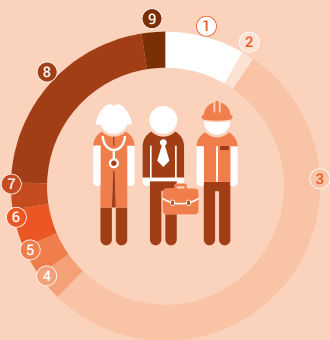

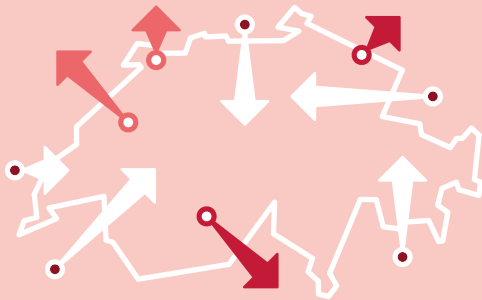

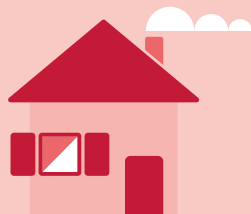

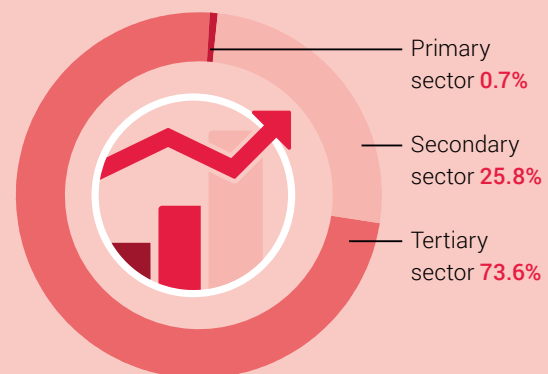

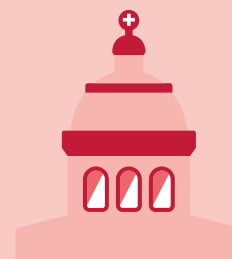


Structure of the Swiss economy

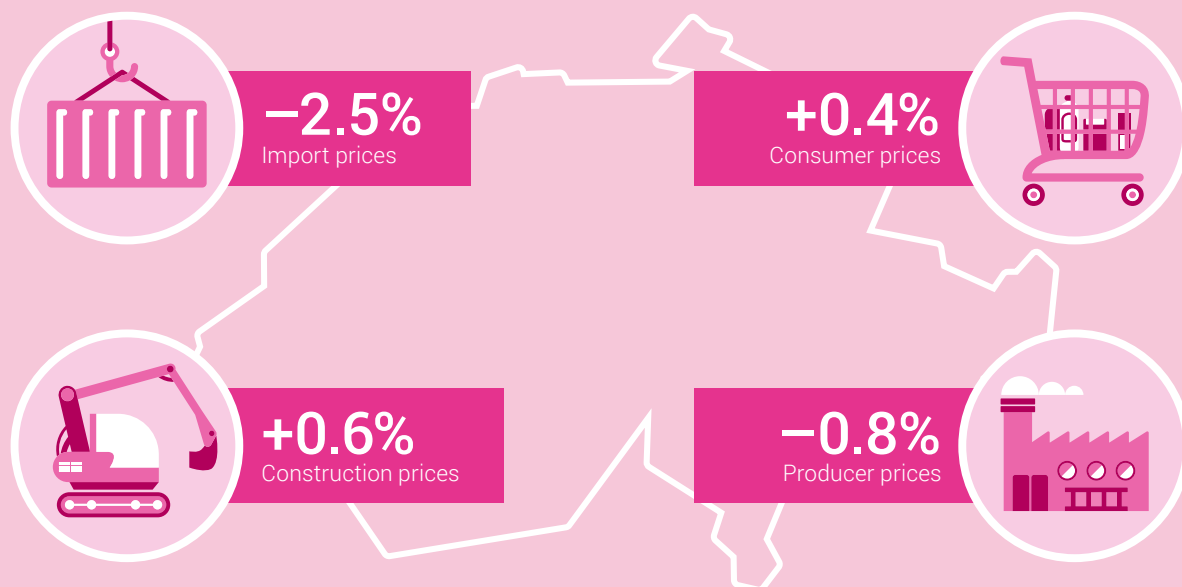

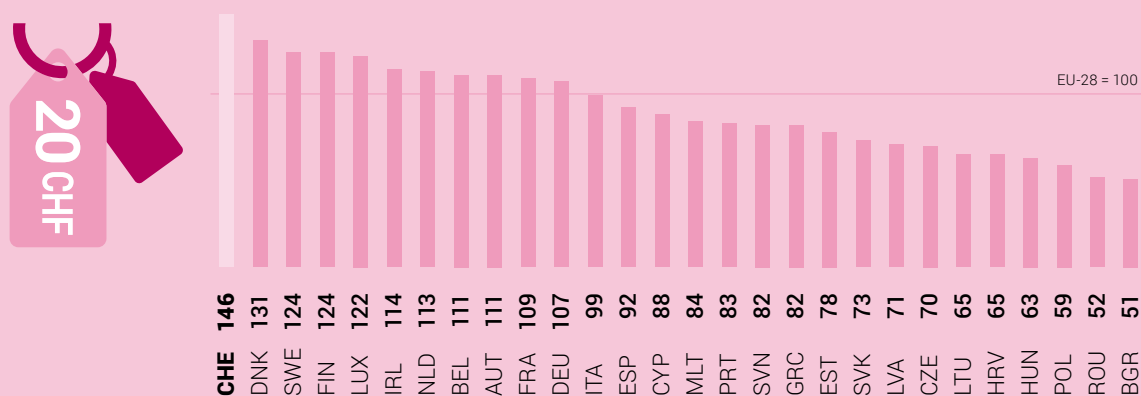
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Change in inflation rates in Switzerland between 2018 and 2019

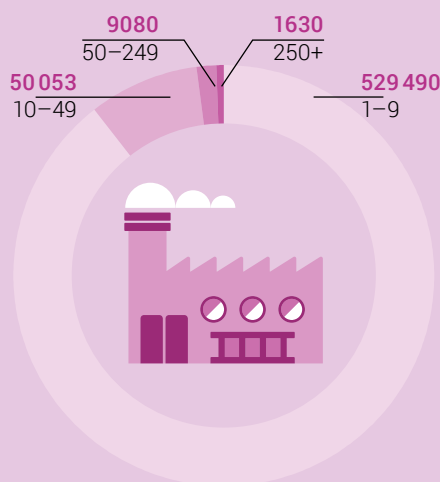

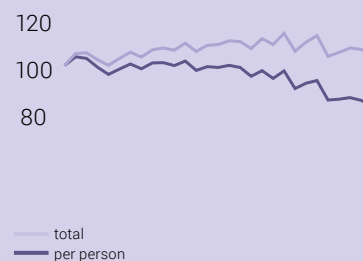

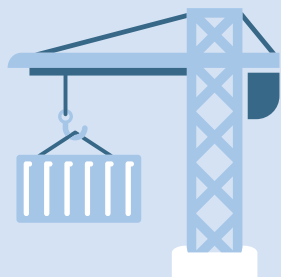

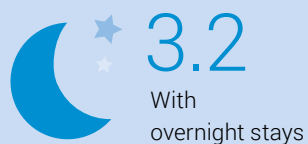

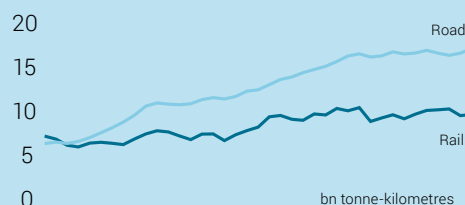

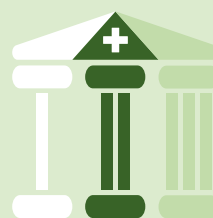

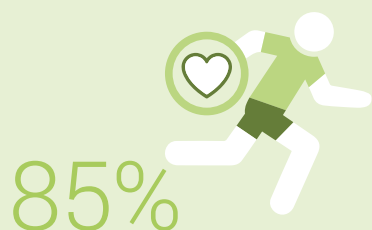

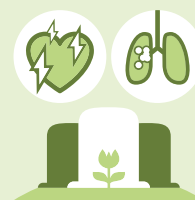

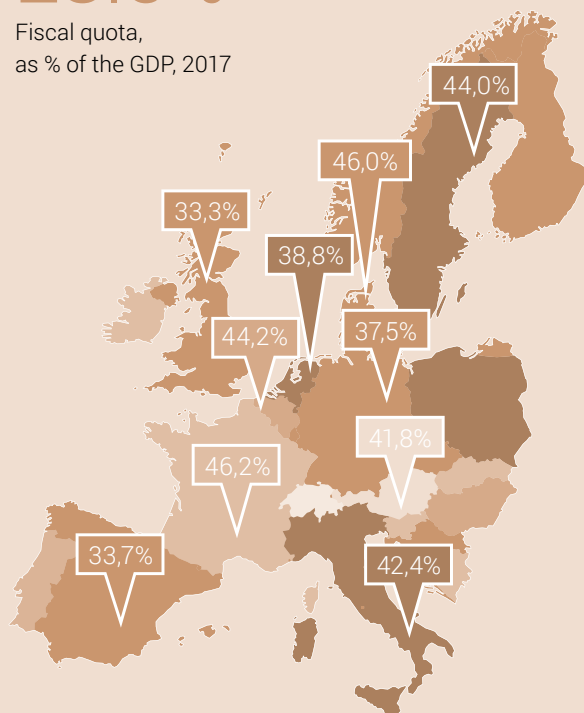

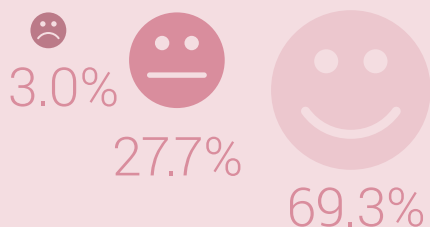

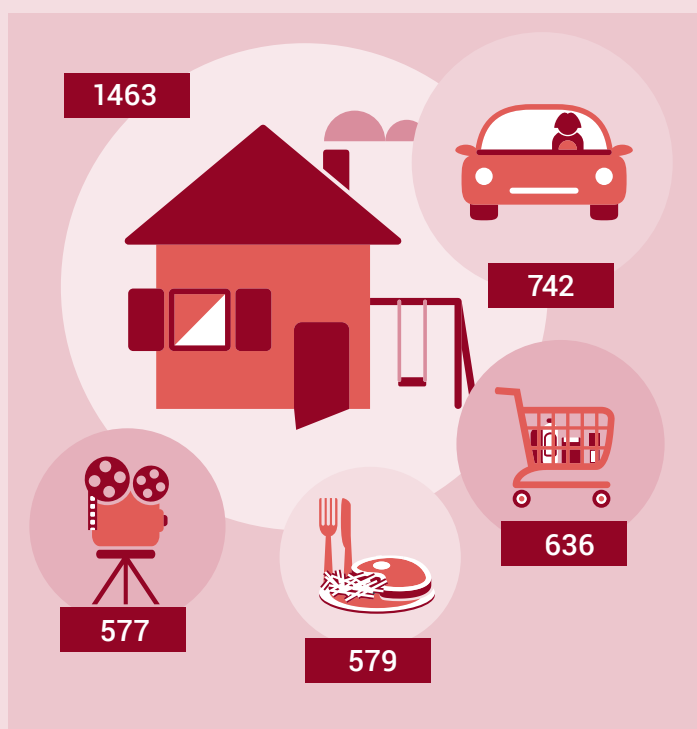

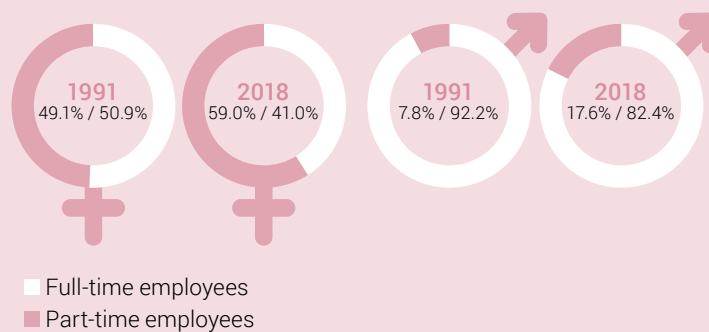

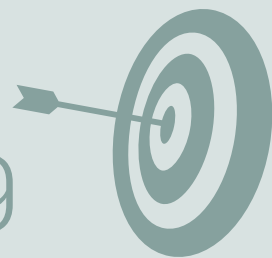

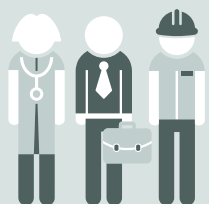

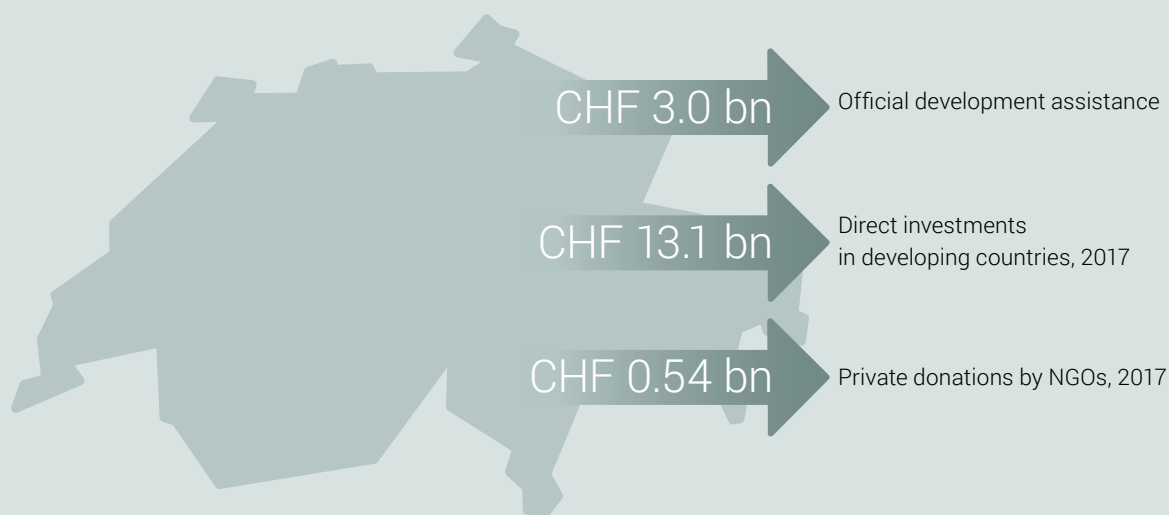
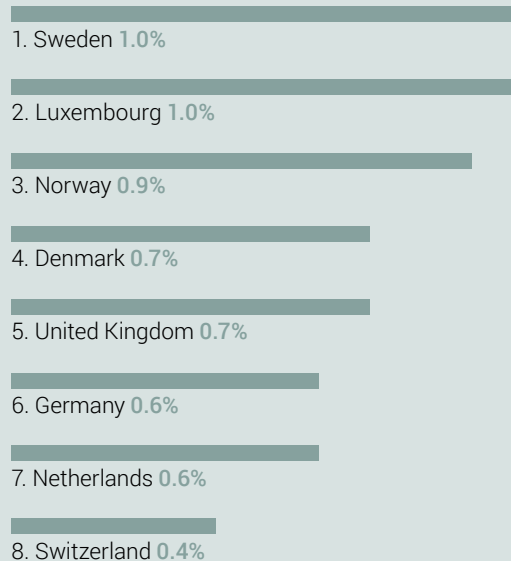
Ecological footprint, 2016
